

Learning Model Options



The following learning model options are available for the 2020-21 school year.

Hybrid Learning Model

The hybrid learning model combines on-campus and at-home learning. Students will attend school half day in the morning or afternoon Tuesday-Friday and then students will be assigned independent work to be completed for the remainder of the school day and on Mondays. There will also be a virtual check-in on Monday. Students earn grades on assignments and report cards as they would in the traditional school setting.

Additional Information:

- Every effort will be made to ensure siblings are on the same schedule.
- Students are assigned to (a) classroom teacher(s).
- Classes are organized into smaller groups to accommodate social distancing.
- Students/staff must remain home if sick.
- On-campus safety precautions include:
 - Students and staff have their temperatures checked prior to entering.
 - Safety and hygiene routines taught in a student-friendly manner.
 - Campus access limited to those providing essential functions for school operations. (Unfortunately, schools cannot accommodate volunteers.)
 - Desks, chairs, counters, sinks, and door handles cleaned/sanitized during transitions and at the end of each school day.

Virtual Learning Model

Students will learn at home in a structured virtual format. Teachers will utilize a variety of instructional strategies including scheduled interactive whole class and small group instruction in addition to independent work. Multiple virtual classroom sessions will be held throughout each school day and attendance is compulsory. Students earn grades on assignments and report cards as they would in the traditional school setting.

Additional Information:

- Students are assigned to (a) classroom teacher(s).
- The teacher provides instruction that aligns with curricular materials and pacing similar to that offered in traditional on-campus instruction.
- Students attend multiple scheduled virtual interactive classroom sessions throughout each school day.
- Attendance in the virtual sessions is required.
- Computer cameras should be turned on to ensure student engagement.

Home School

Students learn at home and progress is monitored by a teacher who regularly checks in with families. Optional virtual tutoring sessions are available for students. Students flexibly engage in the online K12.com platform at times convenient to the family's schedule. Final pass/fail or letter grades will be assigned at the end of each trimester.

Additional Information:

- Families are asked to commit to a full trimester of enrollment.
- Families participating in EASE Home School will sign a participation agreement which can be accessed on the EASE Home School website.
- An intradistrict transfer form (found on the EASE Home School website) must be submitted.
